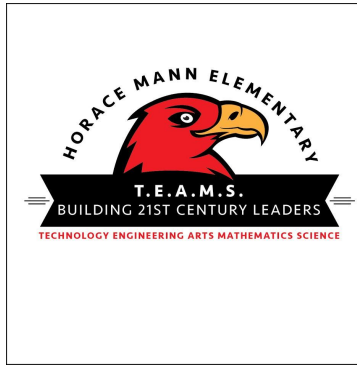


**Falcon Fly-By
